## ASSISTANT DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT REGION 1

Over the past 12 months it has been my privilege to serve Dr. Gorveatte and the Crossroads District of The Wesleyan Church as the Assistant District Superintendent responsible for Region 1.

During this conference year, I began a cohort with seven lead pastors, whose churches range in size and setting. The goal for this cohort has been mutual encouragement and collaboration surrounding multiplication. We have read together, cried together, and prayed together. The fruit of this cohort is starting to be seen as there are multiplication plans in place for churches represented in the cohort. In three of the churches they have begun the process of planting a church or campus.

## ASSISTANT DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

### REGION 2

---

I believe in the local church. I believe in our region. I believe this is just the beginning. I want to briefly share where we have been and where we are going.

#### **Looking Back:**

Our strategy has been relational development and strategic learning this last year.

**Relational Development:** As a lead pastor, I know how daunting the day-to-day activities of ministry can be. There is always someone sick, always a family falling apart, always something that needs repaired or fixed at the church and always a staff transition. You add in the demands of personal life and family and it's easy to feel like everyone is always demanding more out of you. We decided to offer at least one event with the purpose of just saying thank you. This last year we did a Christmas party for pastors and staff. We purposefully decided to go over the top. We had around 150 in attendance and received very positive feedback.

**Strategic Learning:** I believe there are a few key areas that the church really needs to get right. I decided to choose a few of them to offer to the region. We had numerous events over the last year where we brought in guest speakers to help equip our church leaders for greater ministry, both in the local church and in their lives personally. Each of these regional events are designed to be worship services specifically for pastors. They are to be times of renewal and encouragement.

- Discipleship in the local church: We invited our region to the Discipleship Conference in the fall of 2018 here at Trinity.
  - We are also running Discipleship Cohorts led by Jon Wiest with pastors from the region to help them implement more effective discipleship methods in their local church.
- Ian Swyers from Global Partners came and talked about learning to thrive where you are currently serving instead of wishing for a different ministry assignment.
- James Winn, also from Global Partners, came and talked to our church leaders about leading the way in living an evangelistic life.
- Dr. Jim Lo shared about a pastor's personal prayer life.
- We also continue to encourage our pastors to identify places to plant churches at each gathering and to reach out to the district for Church Revitalization resources.

## Looking Forward

This is just the beginning! This next year we are stepping things up to another level. Here's what we have planned so far:

- Inviting the Region to the Exponential Conference in Chicago.
- Dr. Bob Whitesel is coming to talk about instituting change in the local church.
- Steve Becker, a very successful businessman who is connected with Truth at Work, is coming to talk about identifying and having crucial conversations with employees and volunteers.
- Doug Preston, a small church pastor who has had great success, has a real passion to help pastors and is coming to share about leading in a small church setting.
- We look forward to having a panel of retired pastors and their wives speak wisdom and insight into us from their years of ministry and marriage.
- Offering more cohorts that will help institute better discipleship methods.
- We also have a few potential church planters our region is beginning to work with. We hope to see new ground come of this, too.
- Another blow-out Christmas party with our pastors and their wives.
- Lastly, we hope to see even more of our churches begin the Revitalization Process by celebrating those that have already participated in the process. Let the shared stories of the spiritual breakthroughs be the agent of recruitment.

I can't wait! I believe in the local church. I believe in our region. I believe this is just the beginning.

# ASSISTANT DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

## REGION 3

---

The mission of the Crossroads District is to increase the number of healthy, reproducing churches in Indiana and beyond. It is a joy for me to serve our pastors and churches as we endeavor to do our part to reach the 3 million Hoosiers who are currently unaffiliated with any religion. Over this past year in my role as Assistant District Superintendent, I have focused my time and energy on three key areas:

### Church Health and Missional Effectiveness

According to the Crossroads District Guiding Principles, one of our three top priorities as a district is Church Revitalization (see Guiding Principles, MP 1.1.3). As a result of this clear focus, I devote the majority of my time working on the two major Church Health and Missional Effectiveness initiatives of the Crossroads District: ( 1) Maximizing Impact (Consulting process for churches that are stuck, stagnant, or declining), and (2) StratOp (Strategic planning process for healthy churches).

**Initiative #1: Maximizing Impact:** This is a weekend consultation process that culminates with a report that outlines the top five strengths, five areas for improvement, and five prescriptions to help the church make the needed improvements. Following the consultation weekend, the church has a month to consider the findings of the consultation team before deciding whether or not to accept the report and implement the prescriptions.

This past year we conducted Maximizing Impact Weekends at the following churches: North Anderson Wesleyan Church and Albion Cornerstone Wesleyan Church. This brings the total number of churches who have engaged this church health tool to 27 congregations. In addition, we piloted a modified Maximizing Impact experience for churches under 50 in average worship attendance at Tipton Ash Street.

**Initiative #2: StratOp:** Our team of district facilitators (Mark Gorveatte, Jason Tash, Matthew Trexler, and Chris Williams) will guide your leadership through a series of conversations over a three-day period that is designed to clarify mission, vision, strategy, and next steps for your church. The conversation covers three distinct phases:

- **Gaining Perspective.** The facilitator will walk the team through a series of tools to help them answer the question: Where are we right now?
- **Envisioning the Future.** The facilitator uses another set of tools to clarify mission and articulate a picture of where you'd like to be as a church three to five years from now.
- **Action Planning.** As the retreat closes, the group will determine the 2 or 3 action initiatives that will move the church forward. Action Initiative Teams are formed and a game plan established to help the church execute on their top priorities coming out of the retreat.

This past year we conducted StratOp Weekends at the following churches: Marion Lakeview, Bryant, Sweetser, and Noblesville Circle of Hope. We also conducted 7 renewals at the following churches: Columbia City New Hope, Tipton Trinity, Warsaw Pathway, Marion The River, Richmond, Sheridan Six Points, and Marion Brookhaven. Over the last few years, 20 of our churches have hosted a strategic planning weekend, with several of those churches conducting an annual renewal and update of their plan.

### **Region 3 Leadership Development**

Another significant aspect of my role is to provide oversight, strategic coaching, and ministry accountability to Region 3 of the Crossroads District. I have endeavored to do this over this conference year by making personal connections with the pastors in Region 3 in face-to-face meetings, phone calls, emails, and texts.

I have also launched a Leadership Development Cohort comprised of six pastors from Region 3: Don Bayne (New Carlisle), Mike Cloud (Rochester The Cross), Dan Fisher (Delphi Union Street), Logan Patriquin (Lafayette The Branch), Zach Szmara (Logansport The Bridge), and Marc Ulrich (Merrillville RE.THINK Church).

The stated objectives for this cohort are:

- 1) To connect likeminded pastors for relationship building, peer learning, and accountability.
- 2) To spur on forward-leaning ministry in each church represented.
- 3) To create a written, board-approved multiplication plan that will guide the church in multiplying a new service, campus, and/or church in the next 3 years.

- 4) To equip each leader with a reproducible leadership development model to be used with the next level of leaders in Region 3.

We meet each month for approximately 2 hours. In that meeting we do four things: 1) Share an update on current ministry and action commitments we made in the previous meeting, 2) Discuss reading assignments we've completed since our last meeting, 3) Make action commitments to move ministry and multiplication plans forward, and 4) Pray for each other.

In addition, I have hosted two regional gatherings for all of the pastors of Region 3. Our fall gathering was held in November and was focused on developing healthy pastors by equipping them to engage in intentional and strategic self-development and personal growth. The spring gathering was held in March and was focused on effective ministry, which we define as making disciples and multiplying services, campuses, and/or new kingdom communities. In December, we invited all Region 3 pastors and spouses to join us for a Christmas banquet at The Whistle Stop in Monon, Indiana. This was a wonderful time celebrating the season and expressing gratitude for the labor of love our pastoral families offer to each one of the congregations they lead.

# ACTION COMMITTEE

The following resolutions were recommended by the Action Committee:

## DRAFT OF RESOLUTION TO AMEND STANDING RULE CD-19

Whereas, the language of the previous CD-19 has been reviewed by our insurer and they have recommended that the wording be updated to list the Crossroads District as “additional insured” rather than “also insured” to reflect current terminology,

Therefore, recommended that CD-19 be amended with the words “is to be listed as ‘also insured” to be replaced with “shall be listed as ‘additional insured””

So that the CD-19, as amended, will now read:

It is the duty of the Local Board of Administration to provide sufficient property and liability insurance for all buildings and vehicles operated by the local church (Discipline 782;29, 856:8). The district **shall be listed as “additional insured”** on all property policies. Coverage shall be reviewed annually. It is the duty of the Local Board of Administration to ensure that workers compensation is provided for all paid staff.

## DRAFT OF RESOLUTION TO AMEND CD-21

WHEREAS, the wording of CD-21 calls for observance of the Lord’s Supper to be “encouraged monthly” where the intent is to encourage monthly observance;

WHEREAS, it is the intent of CD-21 to encourage pastors in our district to consistently provide the opportunity for believers to be baptized, but that the schedule and demands of each local church vary so that it may not be feasible to offer baptism at least quarterly;

RESOLVED, that the first sentence of CD-21 be amended by striking the words “encouraged monthly in our local churches” and inserting the words “monthly observance shall be encouraged”; and

RESOLVED, that CD-21 shall be further amended by striking the second sentence and inserting “An opportunity for Christian baptism shall be extended at least twice each year for those who are prepared to receive this sacrament.” so that the CD-21 as amended shall read:

The sacrament of the Lord’s Supper shall be observed at least once each quarter and **monthly observance shall be encouraged** (Discipline 725:6). **An opportunity for Christian baptism shall be extended at least twice each year for those who are prepared to receive this sacrament.**

## DRAFT OF STANDING RULE CD-41 AMENDMENT

WHEREAS, the District Conference elects members-at-large of the District Board of Administration and these members have the extended opportunity to deliberate on memorials and other matters that may be considered at the General Conference; and

WHEREAS, the number of General Conference delegates apportioned to the district does now and may in the future exceed the number of members-at-large of the District Board of Administration;

WHEREAS, the Nominating Committee is recommending this amendment in view of the fact that these DBA members-at-large would routinely be on the list of nominees for these delegate positions;

RESOLVED,

That, in any year when there are at least as many General Conference delegates apportioned to the district as there are members-at-large of the DBA, that the members-at-large of the DBA serving through the time of General Conference shall be elected on a single ballot as ex-officio delegates, and

That, when the number of delegates assigned to the district exceeds the number of DBA members-at-large, additional delegates shall be elected as prescribed by Discipline (1503-1526), and

That, Crossroads District Standing Rule CD-41 be amended by adding the following sentence:

*In any year when the number of General Conference delegates apportioned to the district shall be equal to or greater than the number of members-at-large on the DBA, the District Conference shall cast a single ballot to elect those members-at-large members of the DBA as ex-officio delegates to General Conference.*

So that the new CD-41 shall read:

In addition to the ex-officio members on the District Board of Administration, provided by The Wesleyan Discipline, there shall be 10 members-at-large elected by the District Conference. Six of the total membership shall be laypersons. *In any year when the number of General Conference delegates apportioned to the district shall be equal to or greater than the number of members at-large on the DBA, the District Conference shall cast a single ballot to elect those members-at-large of the DBA as ex-officio delegates to General Conference.*

#### **DRAFT OF MEMORIAL RE: MINISTER AND MARRIAGE (3108)**

WHEREAS, it is a clear Biblical principle that leaders may be held to a higher standard than those they serve, as confirmed by the Apostle Paul in his directions to Timothy (1 Timothy 3:1-7) and Titus (Titus 1:6), and even by Proverbs 31:4-5;

WHEREAS, our revised approach to membership (Discipline 260 and 558) already allows for our church leaders to be held to a higher standard of conduct than members in general, for example in requiring abstaining from alcohol use;

WHEREAS, our Wesleyan Constitution (Discipline 265:6) affirms that the clear Scriptural grounds for divorce are the sexual sin of the spouse, so that other rationale may be understood as less than clear and not rising to the leadership standard of being “above reproach” (1 Timothy 3:2);

WHEREAS, the Discipline (3108) already provides a statement on the marriage of ministers and should provide clarity for those cases in which the minister’s marriage is dissolved on grounds other than the clear teaching of Jesus Christ (Matthew 19:8-9) or of the Apostle Paul (I Corinthians 7:10-16);

WHEREAS, consistently demonstrating our commitment to a high view on the authority of Scripture will become increasingly necessary in defending our ecclesiastical governance and biblical worldview in a post-Christian culture that calls us to compromise on sexual morality, definitions of marriage, affirming same-sex attraction, and accepting gender fluidity;

RESOLVED, that Discipline 3108 be amended by inserting the following:

***or is divorced for reasons other than the sexual infidelity of their spouse (Matthew 19:8-9) or abandonment by their spouse (1 Corinthians 7:10-16),***

RESOLVED, that the revised paragraph 310 shall read as follows:

#### **4. Minister and Marriage**

**3108.** Any minister who enters into a marriage relation contrary to the Scriptures, and to those expositions of Scripture as set forth in the Membership Commitments (265:5–7; cf. 410:5–6), ***or is divorced for reasons other than the sexual infidelity of their spouse (Matthew 19:8-9) or abandonment by their spouse (1 Corinthians 7:10-16)***, after having been ordained, commissioned or licensed, shall be dismissed from ministerial standing, provided that guilt shall be established in accord with the judicial processes set forth in *The Discipline* (5206–5212).

1) Is it the clear teaching of the Bible that divorce is allowable on the grounds of sexual unfaithfulness (Matthew 19:8-9) and abandonment (1 Corinthians 7:10-16)?

We have already agreed to this in Discipline 265:6.

2) Can ministers be held to a higher standard of behavior/practice than other members?

We have already agreed to this in our new model of membership as stipulated in Discipline 260 and 558.

3) Can and should ministers be held to a higher standard on marriage and divorce than members?

That is the question on which Wesleyans may disagree today but one which, when decided, will have long-lasting consequences as we brace ourselves for the continued cultural assault against Biblical sexual ethics.

Our vision by the year 2025 is to launch 100 new Kingdom communities, mobilize 1,000 new disciple-making leaders, and baptize 10,000 new Christ followers. **Church Plants:** Currently the DBA has approved the following church planters. These people are either preparing to launch or have launched.

- Terry and Lennaire Vaughn (South Bend The Bridge Urban Church)
- Michael & Kim Hewitt (Muncie Rising Hope) – Launched September 16th, 2018, with 150 people
- Craig and Tiffany Thurmon (Indianapolis Encounter Assembly) – Currently meeting in a home with Launch Team.
- John & Heather Miller (Speedway Way City Church) – Currently developing a social media platform as they raise funds and prepare to launch; they have just found a building to begin meeting in.
- Joe & Dawn Deckard (Pendleton campus of Fishers Waterline) – Planted in Pendleton, their launch is a brand new campus that was birthed from Waterline Church in Fishers
- Aldean Pablo (Pre-Launch phase, with an anticipated Launch, possibly in Roanoke, Indiana, set for September 2020)
- Ellorgy (Jose) Guerrero (Elkhart Iglesia Wesleyana Cielos Abiertos)
- Dr. David and Kathy Drury (Fishers One MultiChurch Network), with Rev. Gwen Jackson (Irvington campus) and Pastors Rochelle and Travis Jenkins (Circle City campus): Combined, they had thirty-eight people on Easter Sunday, with only eleven Believers. Many of the others attending the East-er gathering were Muslims who have just begun exploring Jesus.



**Exponential:** We welcomed forty-three of our Crossroads District pastors and leaders to Exponential, “Made for More,” in Orlando, Florida, in March. It was a great time of encouragement and a chance to learn what it means to make disciples as we become Level 5 churches (Multiplying/Disciplemaking churches). In addition, three people from the district attended the Exponential Multiplication cohort led by Dr. Ed Love.

**Discipleship:** The district and denomination is grateful for Jon Wiest and the Trinity staff for their Discipleship efforts. On October 1-2, 2018 Trinity hosted their first disciple-making church conference. It inspired and equipped churches and pastors to build disciple-making churches. There were 275 pastors and lay leaders in attendance from five different districts, with 75 people being from Crossroads District. In January an exclusive Crossroads District cohort was formed for deeper learning and shared encouragement.

**Training & Assessment:** I’m grateful for having had the opportunity to assess with Tom and Sarah Cochran in our Assessment Center. They have done a great job leading. However, due to a job change, they have stepped down from leading assessments. We look forward to our upcoming September 23-25 assessment, with Jessie and Aimee Pratt leading. Also, I am thankful for John and Danielle Freed, who continue to champion church planting, hosting training boot camps and continue to be a wonderful resource for church planting.

### Mozambique

Last October, the Xai-Xai Wesleyan Bible School held their 14<sup>th</sup> graduation ceremony. The staff and students send their deepest thanks to the Crossroads District for their continued support. This year

there are 13 new freshmen enrolled, including one married couple. Your support is crucial to continue developing leaders as we strive to reach every corner of Mozambique with the gospel.

Earlier this year the nation of Mozambique was devastated by cyclone Idai. The storm left many people homeless, and destroyed 4 Wesleyan churches in Beira alone. Relief efforts were slow due to power shortages and washed out roads. Then in late April another cyclone, Kenneth, hit northern Mozambique. It was the first time in recorded history that two cyclones hit in the same year! Thankfully, Kenneth hit in areas that weren't as densely populated. The Crossroads District came together and matched every dollar sent to the Wesleyan Emergency Relief Fund to double the impact of your dollars. To date, over \$5,000 has been matched in relief funds.

This past year you have stepped up and provided support to the Global Partners Leadership Initiative by giving nearly \$20,000 to be matched in both Bangladesh and Mozambique. Thank you for your continued prayers and financial support! We will continue to dedicate ourselves to equipping pastors globally to multiply disciples and churches!

- Coordinating periodic meetings for our pastors and leaders
- Facilitating communications with the district office and churches as requested
- Speaking when invited and translating as needed at local and district events
- Mentoring several of our Hispanic pastors regularly, including numerous one-on-one meetings in person and via video conferencing
- Training to equip Hispanic and Anglo churches for more effective ministry

**Immigration Reform.** Our Hispanic ministries and families continue to face significant challenges in our current cultural and social climate, and we continue to pray for the reformation of our country's broken immigration laws and policies. The Wesleyan Church offers Basic Immigration Law Training for local churches desiring to establish an immigration legal services site (cf. "Immigrant Connection - The Wesleyan Church."). We thank God for His faithfulness in these times and for our dedicated group of pastors and leaders. Please remember them in your prayers, along with their congregations.

**Ministry Expansion and Changing Paradigms.** Over half of our nation's growth comes from the Hispanic population, so the need to expand these ministries is great. Now 2<sup>nd</sup> generation Hispanics outnumber immigrants. Many of them do not feel at home in traditional non-Hispanic mono-cultural churches, so we need new ministry paradigms.

Our Hispanic pastors and leaders greatly appreciate your continuing prayers and support for these ministries.
